Why do we study Acting Through Song?

• Focus on storytelling

Prioritise text over voice

- Practice working with direction
- Develop flexibility/versatility.



Starting my own song Establishing the given circumstances

Who am I talking to?

What do I want?

What are the stakes?

(How badly do I want it? What will happen if I don't get it?)

What has **just** happened to make me sing?







Task 1

Now I'd like you to chose a song you would like to work on and answer the previous questions in detail.

Remember:

- Be specific
- Be clear
- Keep it simple, acting shouldn't be overly complicated, but it needs to be



Actioning – A Way To Make Text Active

Actions – What am I *doing* to my *target*

An Action is a transitive verb which creates behavior.

Some practitioners believe that the best actions fit the formula:

l <u>Verb</u> You

I <u>Verb</u> Target

or 'I Implore God' 'I Beg God' 'I Cradle Marius'

Audition Material Advice

- Choose audition pieces which allow us insight in to who you are
- Be careful of vocal "risks"
- Avoid songs with a 'character'- voice performance (Avenue Q, Adelaide's Lament etc)
- Monologues don't give yourself too many challenges in terms of character
- Work with the voice you have now, not the voice you want to have in 5 years!
