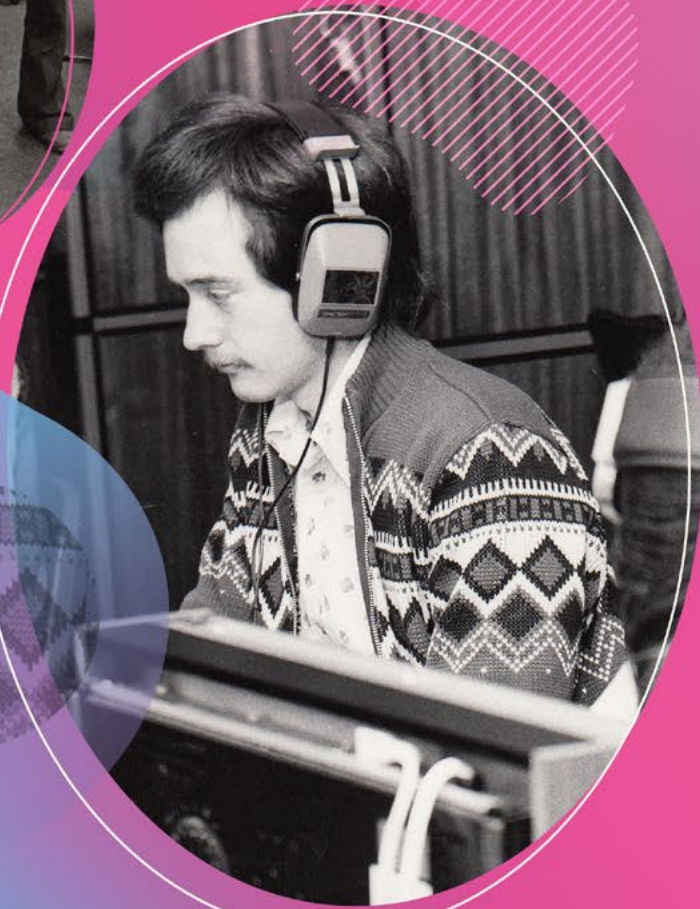

YOUR FACILITIES

Whether you want a quiet space to study, a practice room fitted with professional performing and recording equipment, an industry-standard recording studio or a purpose-built dance studio, you'll find the space you need at the conservatoire.

As a specialist institution, we pride ourselves on providing you with the highest quality music and performing arts facilities, and the tools to learn and create, helping you fulfil your creative vision.



MUSIC FACILITIES

PERFORMANCE SPACES

The Venue: Our flagship 350-seat performance space hosts events and performances throughout the year. From musical theatre productions and award-winning festivals to student recitals and performances from visiting industry professionals, there's always something to see in this impressive space.

Recital Room: Our 120-seat Recital Room is used for more intimate performances, workshops and regular student nights, including Crosswire – our Pop and Production student showcase – and B-Side, our Jazz night.

Rooftop Bar: Providing spectacular panoramic views across the city, the Rooftop Bar, which is adjacent to The Venue, offers a social and networking space for use by students and staff, with additional breakout areas and a section for acoustic performances.



INSTRUMENT FACILITIES

All-Steinway School: We're the only English conservatoire to hold the coveted All-Steinway School status – meaning 90% of our pianos come from the Steinway family, including eight grand pianos in bookable rooms and two Model Ds in The Venue. Our Steinway pianos are used for daily practices, virtuoso masterclasses and the Leeds International Piano Competition.

Keyboards: We're proud to be a Roland Academy in association with Roland UK. You'll be able to access a wide range of Roland keyboards, synthesisers and recording equipment in our dedicated Roland Suite and from our facilities loan store.

Percussion: Leeds Conservatoire is a recognised centre for percussion studies, with access to a wide range of instruments. We have a dedicated percussion room with standard orchestral percussion, many instruments from global traditions and quality marimbas and vibraphones for four-mallet work, and six bookable drum rooms.



PRODUCTION FACILITIES

Our fantastic studio facilities* include:

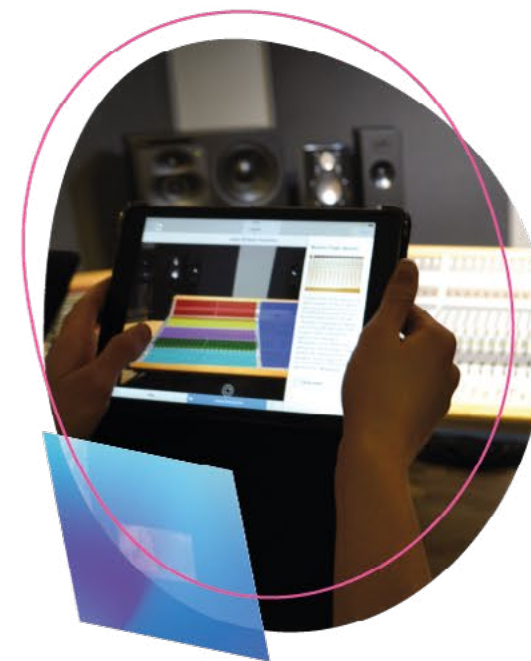
- Six recording studios with Audient, SSL and Neve equipment
- Seven mixing rooms with vocal rooms
- 5.1 surround sound room with projector
- DJ Suite equipped with professional-standard equipment and software
- Six Apple Mac Labs, containing more than 100 high-spec iMacs with MIDI keyboards and audio interfaces
- Latest versions of Logic Pro, Pro Tools, Sibelius, Reason and Ableton Live and Adobe Creative Cloud
- Augmented Reality (AR) app for Audient sound mixing desks

*Independent access to studio facilities is only available to certain students depending on their specialism and level of study.

OTHER FACILITIES

We have more than 40 bookable practice rooms, including individual, band and ensemble rooms. We also have a huge range of instruments, microphones and recording equipment that you can borrow to support recording, mixing and rehearsing.

And on the top floor of our main campus building, there's a mixed study space with individual study pods, group work desks and breakout spaces with comfy seating, perfect for quiet study, holding professional meetings or collaborative working with your peers.



PERFORMING ARTS FACILITIES

Our goal is to provide you with the highest quality facilities while putting you at the heart of Leeds' cultural scene. Our training and performance facilities aren't limited to one space, but found throughout Leeds' Cultural Quarter and beyond, giving you the chance to make your mark on this city.



PLAYHOUSE SQUARE

With a panoramic view over the city landscape, the fifth floor of our Playhouse Square campus, next door to Leeds Playhouse, houses purpose-built performing arts facilities, providing you with all you need to excel in your training.

Our state-of-the-art rehearsal and ensemble rooms sit at the heart of this development. Two large and two smaller dance studios, all with floor-to-ceiling windows, a drama classroom, two band rooms, one-to-one singing rooms and two breakout areas complete this dedicated performing arts space. In addition, you'll showcase your work and undertake productions in a 180-seat purpose-built theatre.

MABGATE STUDIOS

Our studios in Mabgate are just a few minutes' walk from Leeds Conservatoire and Playhouse Square in 'one of the coolest neighbourhoods in the UK', as labelled by Condé Nast Traveller.

Here, you'll find four spaces ideal for rehearsals and staging your projects and final year productions. Combined with bright, spacious, and well-equipped communal spaces, Mabgate Studios has been designed to create a sense of community between you and other students, while also supporting your development.

YORKSHIRE DANCE

Just a stone's throw away from our main campus building, Yorkshire Dance's facilities host some of our tuition in bright and airy studios with sprung maple wood floors and tremendous acoustics.

DANCE STUDIO LEEDS

This versatile studio, created in a converted textile mill, is just a ten-minute walk from our main building. It boasts full-length mirrors, sprung dance floors, sound systems, and breakout spaces.

OTHER SPACES

You'll also get to rehearse in the professional surrounds of Northern Ballet and Leeds Playhouse studios, which are both just minutes away from our main building and Playhouse Square campus.

OTHER FACILITIES

TAILORED LEARNING RESOURCES

You'll have access to extensive online and physical resources, a range of study environments to suit our students' needs, and a wealth of academic and learning support for students to access throughout their studies.

Our Virtual Learning Environment is a central online resource where you can find course resources and information, as well as submit assignments, create interactive portfolios and access learning activities.

We use Panopto, an online video platform, to capture lectures, livestream concerts and conferences and host extra-curricular video content such as workshops, masterclasses, online tutorials and student showcases.

Our Music Business Hub is a dedicated space where students can study, collaborate or hold meetings with clients.

CAFÉ BAR

The Café Bar is open for breakfast, lunch and dinner, selling great-value food with discounted rates for students. Located in the centre of campus, the Café Bar is the social hub of the conservatoire. It is also a performance space with regular event nights, pop-ups, and plenty of Welcome Week activities.

THE LIBRARY

Set in the Quarry Hill Skyline building within the Leeds Cultural Quarter, this impressive space is home to a range of resources and study spaces for our students. This two-storey flexible facility houses private study pods with screens for group working, sit-stand desks and silent working areas, as well as open-access computers and a group study room.

In the library, you'll have access to:

- Around 8,000 books
- 28,000 items of printed music for individual and group performance
- A collection of more than 500 play texts
- More than 80 scholarly journal subscriptions in electronic and print format, including a huge range of digitised journal articles in the arts and humanities on JSTOR
- Access to online reference material from databases such as Oxford Music Online, Drama Online and IPA Source.

From the creative and innovative performances that take place on campus, to the incredible music and theatre scene in the city and beyond, you'll be presented with countless opportunities to demonstrate your talent from day one.

From high-profile festivals – including Sound City in Liverpool, We Out Here Festival in Devon, Live at Leeds, London Jazz Festival, and various opportunities overseas – to the conservatoire's ensembles and regular showcases, there are performance and experience opportunities to suit every specialism.

Our partnerships with nationally recognised organisations, such as Opera North and Leeds Playhouse, give students the chance to develop their craft alongside industry professionals.

SOUND CITY

Our partnership with Sound City Festival in Liverpool started in 2016. This has provided opportunities for students to perform live in front of labels and agents, gain radio play and press coverage, and to network with industry professionals as well as internships and work placement experience.

NATIONAL JAZZ FESTIVALS

In recent years, our students have performed at Jazz festivals across the country, including Manchester Jazz Festival, JazzLeeds Festival and London Jazz Festival.

CHRISTMAS CONCERT

Our annual Musical Theatre Christmas concert is a sold-out festive event, featuring all Musical Theatre students, sharing contemporary and classic Christmas hits.

UNDERNEATH THE STARS FESTIVAL

In 2023, our students performed on main stages and experienced backstage, technical and artist liaison placements at this family-friendly Yorkshire festival of folk music and arts. Conservatoire staff and students also hosted practical music workshops for festival goers of all ages to take part in.

FESTIVAL OF DIONYSUS

In their second week of training, our Acting and Actor Musician students work with Leeds-based theatre company Slung Low to host their *Festival of Dionysus*, Greek-inspired new works by the campfire.

BLACK LIVES IN MUSIC

Leeds Conservatoire is a founding member partner of Black Lives in Music (BLiM), giving us access to a wealth of industry-specific research on racial equality. BLiM supports our students through specialist masterclasses and talks that elevate the voices of those who may previously have been under-represented in our community. It also provides guidance to the conservatoire in our continued efforts to remove the systemic and perceived barriers to joining us. This developing relationship is built around a shared commitment to support ethnically and culturally diverse people in our organisation, and the wider industry, to achieve equality.

REGULAR PERFORMANCE OPPORTUNITIES

Our students regularly perform at our in-house showcases, as well as at bi-monthly Popular and Music Production night, Crosswire, and bi-monthly Jazz night, B-Side. Our ensembles perform regularly across the region and beyond – Leeds Contemporary Singers were born out of our Contemporary Pop Choir and went on to win BBC One's Pitch Battle. Our Contemporary Orchestra and Choir performed at Leeds Town Hall with Marc Almond and the Students' Union Big Band were featured in a high-profile Christmas advert campaign for LG.

The conservatoire actively seeks out industry partnerships that provide opportunities for you to work with professionals, expand your network and to join initiatives within the city and beyond. These partnerships are part of our commitment to put student experience at the heart of what we do.

LEEDS PLAYHOUSE

Our Leeds Playhouse partnership is centred around collaborative activity of academic and artistic value. It gives our Acting and Actor Musician students the opportunity to perform at the Playhouse before schools touring. Previous productions have included *Macbeth* and *As You Like It*.

MEDIA TRACKS

This partnership aims to support talent development in the music industry, highlighting library music (also known as production or stock music) as a potential career path for our student composers and artists. In line with our commitment to equality, diversity and inclusion, MediaTracks is committed to promoting music and artists currently underrepresented in the music industry.

OPERA NORTH

Through our partnership with Opera North, students across year groups have a number of opportunities to work with one of the UK's leading opera companies. You could find yourself playing side-by-side with the orchestra of Opera North, observing the production and rehearsal process, working with conductors and chorusmasters on repertoire and having access to workshops and masterclasses with visiting artists. You can also apply to support delivery of Opera North's music education community residency programme, In Harmony. The access students have to the Opera North company creates a dialogue between the next generation of artists and makers which can help both organisations in supporting the future of Classical music and beyond.

ORCHESTRAS LIVE

Orchestras Live believes that orchestras are for everyone. It is a national producer and creates projects where music and creativity can thrive. The partnership between Leeds Conservatoire and Orchestras Live sets out the shared commitment to promote and support professional orchestral skills development programmes for Leeds Conservatoire students.

THEATRE SEASON

Performing Arts students star in our annual Season of Live Performance, including nine fully staged plays and musicals across theatres in Leeds. In addition to this season of established repertoire, we work with regionally and nationally recognised industry partners to create new work. Previous partners have included BYMT, Academy of Live Technology, Slung Low and Mercury Musical Developments.

EMPLOYABILITY

Our Employability & Enterprise Team provide industry-focused, tailored support and funding opportunities, increasing the career sustainability of our students during study and after graduating.

- We have various funding opportunities available for students and graduates to apply for, helping them to progress new projects or ideas, produce valuable promotional materials (including videos and photos), develop brands and release strategies, take productions on tour, access legal advice and much more.
 - Further opportunities to attend a variety of industry conferences and workshops are advertised throughout the year.
 - Quarry Music, our inhouse library music project offers students the opportunity to have their music published via our partner catalogue provider MediaTracks. The project is delivered by a team of student interns, nurturing skills in A&R, metadata entry, social media promotion and release scheduling
 - Our performing arts graduates go on to find representation with a variety of industry recognised agents. Our Spotlight approved in house agency provides another access point, connecting you to roles in theatre, television and film productions.
- Our Employability & Enterprise team offer specialist industry relevant guidance, access to industry mentors, and general careers advice to help students and graduates navigate the creative industries. We work with a variety of local and national arts supporters to sign post further opportunities for skills development and funding, while sharing relevant employment opportunities across the region.

Renowned for its rich musical heritage and thriving arts scene, nightlife and huge variety of independent bars and places to eat, the city caters to all tastes and interests.

The city can offer you countless opportunities for performance, collaboration, and networking with historic and avant-garde theatres to grassroots venues and festivals.



YOUR CITY OF LIVE MUSIC

When it comes to live music, you're spoilt for choice in Leeds. Whatever your tastes, this is the city that can hit all the right notes.

For unrivalled concert experiences and some of the biggest international names, we have the massive First Direct Arena and the O2 Academy Leeds in the heart of the city.

If you love independent venues or intimate settings, The Wardrobe directly opposite campus is one of many in the city. This popular indie venue is the perfect break from lectures.

A legendary staple in Leeds' music scene, the Brudenell Social Club is widely regarded as one of the best venues in the country. Shows happen nearly every night of the week, from local acts, upcoming artists and the occasional big name dropping in for a rare intimate appearance.

Belgrave Music Hall is another vibrant music hotspot. If you like indie, pop, rock, jungle, rap, techno, big stars, or smaller artists in a cool environment, then this is a must-visit venue.

Love hearing jazz in an underground speakeasy setting? Head to The Domino Club, accessed via a secret door in a functioning barbers.

Maybe live music bars will be more your thing? You'll be in Oporto, Sela Bar, Santiago, HiFi Club, Hyde Park Book Club, Key Club, Headrow House, Boom or Wharf Chambers.

If you're a fan of seeing the world's finest classical musicians, then you'll find yourself in the stunning Leeds Town Hall. The magnificent main Victoria Hall is the ideal setting to enjoy jaw-dropping classical music, including regular performances from the Orchestra of Opera North.

For experimental classical recitals, touring artists and chamber operas, you have the Howard Assembly Room. And if you're into opera, you'll be enthralled by the national opera company, Opera North, who are based just a few minutes away from the conservatoire.

Leeds Conservatoire also hosts numerous productions and events in our on-campus performance spaces and we regularly collaborate with many of the city's top venues to showcase student talent.

YOUR CITY OF PERFORMANCE

There is no shortage of opera, plays and musical performances across Leeds theatres and performing arts spaces.

Leeds Grand Theatre, aka the 'Grand Old Lady of Leeds', is the biggest theatre in the city and has been showcasing West End Productions, local stories, and boasting world premieres since 1878.

Leeds Playhouse, which is just a three-minute walk away from campus, is an artistic beacon for the North. The theatre puts community and engagement at the forefront and has a varied calendar of events throughout the year.

The Carriageworks theatre is a forward-thinking venue that hosts a variety of theatre, film and events for all ages and interests. And the UK's longest running music hall, City Varieties Music Hall is a Grade II-listed venue full of comedy, shows, talks, and annual pantomimes.

Leeds is also home to prestigious theatre and dance companies such as Slung Low, Yorkshire Dance, Phoenix Dance Theatre, Northern School of Contemporary Dance and Red Ladder Theatre Company, offering a programme of internationally renowned performances all year.

With all venues located in the centre of Leeds, and many offering enticing student rates, you'll never feel deprived of plays and musicals.

YOUR ARTS HOTSPOT

Leeds is home to internationally renowned galleries such as Leeds Art Gallery and the Henry Moore Institute. You'll also find modern and contemporary art and unmissable events in galleries and art-spaces around the city. The city is bursting with history outside of its galleries too; head to Leeds City Museum, or the national museum of armour and weaponry, The Royal Armoury.

For book lovers, check out Leeds' two beautiful libraries, both of which are Grade II-listed. Leeds Central Library, home to the stunning Tiled Café, and the Leeds Library, the UK's oldest surviving subscription library.

If you're a fan of film, then Leeds won't leave you disappointed. The city has many multiplex cinemas showing the latest releases, while also being home to Hyde Park Picture House, one of the UK's longest-running independent cinemas, which shows a mix of indie releases and cult classics.

And on the outskirts of Leeds you'll find the Yorkshire Sculpture Park. This unique gallery is home to work by some of the most incredible artists from all over the world, set in 500 acres of stunning parkland.

YOUR CITY OF INDUSTRY

Leeds' creative ecosystem means that it's a place of immense opportunity.

The city is now home to EMI North, the first major UK record label to open outside of London, as well as leading independent labels and promoters who run the biggest music events in the city.

You'll have no shortage of local casting agencies to source your next big role, from our very own agency (The Leeds Conservatoire Agency) to Leeds-based IPM, Northern Lights Management, Lime, and Direct Personal Management.

You'll find plenty of recording studios throughout the city, among renowned performing arts venues providing theatre opportunities galore.

You'll also find some of the most renowned names in television production residing in the city, including Channel 4 headquarters, an ITV Television Centre (home of the beloved soap *Emmerdale*), City Talking and Sky's Digital & Technology Services Campus.

So, whether you want to pursue your passions in music, drama or both, Leeds has a wealth of industry opportunities waiting to be seized.

FOOD AND DRINK

With so many fantastic food and drink festivals, award-winning independent eateries and big-chain restaurants, you'll never be short of something delicious to try in Leeds.

From a rotating line-up of street food vendors at Trinity Kitchen and the Belgrave Street Feast, to an array of delicious independent cafés and international restaurants, Leeds is a gastronome's delight.

Leeds Market, located opposite campus, is packed with independent food stalls – perfect if you need a break from your studies.

YOUR ACCOMMODATION

Leeds is one of the most popular student cities in the UK, with a wide variety of student accommodation to suit all needs and budgets.

We work in partnership with established providers to manage accommodation for our students. Most of our students live in Joseph Stones House in their first year, which is located on the Leeds Conservatoire site, or at One Mill Street, which is just a four-minute walk from campus.

Alternative accommodation is also available, and after their first year, most of our students find accommodation themselves for the subsequent years of their studies.

BA (HONS) MUSIC CLASSICAL



Our Classical degree is for talented performers and composers who want to push the boundaries of classical music, honing their creativity and imagination in our unique conservatoire environment.

You'll develop as a performer or composer through one-to-one tuition throughout your studies, while broadening your experience and knowledge, giving you the opportunity to define classical music for the next generation.

Our conservatoire education is characterised by inspirational training with experts in your specialism, supported by bespoke workshops and masterclasses from professionals.

TRAINING WITH OPERA NORTH

Our partnership with Opera North gives students the opportunity to play or sing alongside the Orchestra and Chorus of Opera North, attend rehearsals with the company, work with conductors and chorus masters, and attend masterclasses from visiting artists. Classical students have attended conducting workshops with Opera North players and composers have written scenes for Opera North musicians to perform.

This relationship gives students a direct industry link and the opportunity to see a professional company in action. It also provides access to Opera North's 'In Harmony' programme via a placement scheme, working with more than 2,000 young people from all backgrounds.

PERFORMANCE OPPORTUNITIES

We work with a range of regional venues to give you performance or composition showcase opportunities. These include an annual opera project, regular lunchtime concerts, projects with dance students, or performing in high-profile events with acclaimed musicians.

Unique to a UK conservatoire, this degree centres on production, composition, and DJ performance technologies. You'll master a range of industry-standard DJ production software and technology in dedicated music production suites, helping you to evolve your own sound.

TEACHING

Through small group tuition in our bespoke DJ Suite and Mac Labs, you'll get to grips with a range of production techniques and electronic music styles. Our industry expert tutors will support you to develop your DJ skills and prepare you for performing your own mixes in live settings. Within a collaborative environment, you'll study alongside like-minded artists including our Music Production students.

FILM MUSIC



Writing music for the moving image has become an increasingly sought-after area of expertise.

Develop your composition, production and arrangement skills and master an entrepreneurial approach to working in the film music industry with this pioneering Film Music degree.

An impressive number of our alumni have gone on to compose work for independent films, Hollywood blockbusters and studios run by high-profile practitioners, such as Hans Zimmer.

TEACHING

The first of its kind in a UK conservatoire, this course uniquely combines one-to-one composition tuition, production skills lessons (honing technical and DAW skills), and supporting topics. These include harmony, aural and orchestration skills, and historical, cultural and professional studies.

The course allows for optional modules so you can tailor your degree to your specialisms.

INDUSTRY OPPORTUNITIES

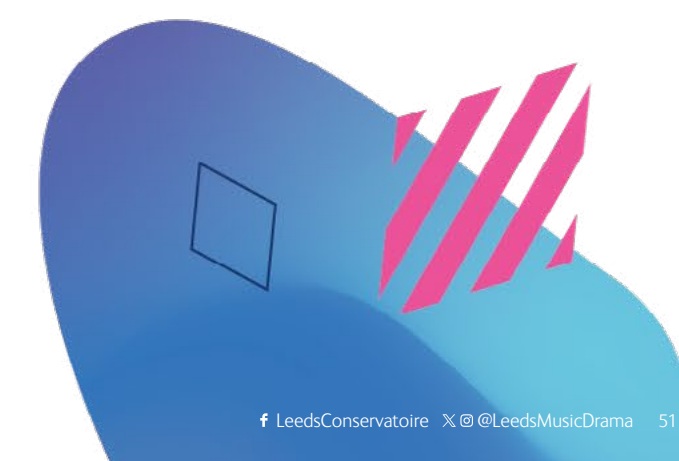

Celebrate your distinctive artistry and personal creativity and explore music from all over the world with this unique and inclusive degree.

You'll develop an understanding and appreciation of the social movements, activism and rebel traditions that are central to this progressive art form.

Expanding on these elements through performance, songwriting, composition, arrangement and recording techniques, you'll be able to express your creativity in any style you see fit.

Our musicians celebrate their stories through blending many styles and genres from blues, folk and trad to rap, metal and electronic music.

As a performer, composer, or both, you'll discover how styles evolved in different communities, and how traditions have been created and preserved. You'll experiment with other genres and cultural identities, capture field recordings and build your portfolio.

The conservatoire's rich heritage in Jazz education provides the backdrop to this highly collaborative course. Our Jazz degree will shape you into a forward-thinking, creative artist grounded in the tradition but with a hunger to take your music to new dimensions.

Improvisation is at the very heart of jazz and is a way of life at Leeds Conservatoire. We offer a supportive and collaborative space in which you can explore, experiment and find your own musical identity.

TEACHING

Alongside one-to-one tuition with experts in your specialism, you'll study composition, arranging, aural awareness, language of jazz, harmony, rhythmic studies, contemporary improvisation, ensemble skills and musicology.

NOTABLE ALUMNI

Lara Jones, recipient of Help Musicians UK's Peter Whittingham Jazz Award, Jerwood Arts Jazz Encounter Fellowship, and Manchester Jazz Festival's Level Up.

Ashley Henry was nominated for the Jazz FM Awards 2020. His debut album was featured in 'BBC Radio 6 Music recommends album of the year', shortlisted for 'Jazz Album of the Year' as part of the Worldwide Awards 2020 and won 'Album of the Year' at the Jazz Japan Awards.

You'll receive expert advice from world-renowned performers, composers and industry professionals through weekly workshops and masterclasses. Recent guests have included Mark Turner, Clarence Penn, Nikki Iles, Champion Fulton, Aaron Parks, Eric Harland, and Jeff Ballard.

ENSEMBLES

As well as weekly small group lessons and rehearsals, you'll have the opportunity to join a range of ensembles depending on your interests in and outside of the course. This includes our:

BA (HONS) MUSIC

POPULAR MUSIC



Popular Music is a diverse and exciting degree that welcomes a vast range of interests, tastes, and perspectives. We champion free expression, original artistry and identity, and encourage creative risks.

This course allows you to determine your journey and make your own decisions about style, assessments, and specialisms. Whether its metal, punk, pop, indie, hip-hop, soul, country, or anything else, you'll be supported in your creative endeavours. You'll develop your performance, composition, and production skills, critical awareness, and understanding of commercial industry and popular music culture.

TEACHING

You'll receive one-to-one tuition on your principal instrument alongside band work, collaborative sessions and workshops. These include studying the music industry, its history and context, performance techniques, artistry and creativity. Our industry links include major labels like Sony, Universal, Polydor and Decca, as well as independent and local labels and promoters.

Benji Totten (above) is an integral part of BRIT Award-winner Jorja Smith's band. He's performed at Glastonbury Festival, and international tours in the USA, Canada and South America. He most recently joined Sam Smith's band for their world tour in 2023.

MASTERCLASSES

You'll be trained by expert producers and leading software specialists in bespoke studios and high-spec Mac Labs. You'll also master a portfolio of production and recording techniques and gain hands-on experience in composition and arrangement with the freedom to express yourself musically in any genre.

TEACHING

Small group teaching underpins our practical approach to learning, supported by focused, independent studio time to develop your projects. Benefitting from our strong industry links, you'll have access to a variety of masterclasses from acclaimed professionals throughout the year.

COLLABORATION

Working alongside a campus community of more than 1,400 musicians, composers and entrepreneurs will give you the opportunity to produce musicians of all genres, collaborate on live events and take part in many other creative enterprises.

SONGWRITING



Make a lasting impact on the music industry and focus on any genre you want – from acoustic to electronic, mainstream to leftfield – our Songwriting degree.

You'll gain valuable experience in solo and collaborative songwriting, honing your skills to craft songs for personal projects, bands, and other artists. You'll enhance your proficiency in industry-standard recording software, foster critical awareness, and deepen your understanding of commercial industry practices and popular music culture. These aspects collectively prepare you for a successful career as a songwriter.

TEACHING

You'll receive weekly one-to-one tuition with experienced songwriters and regular timetabled sessions in band practice rooms where you'll have the creative freedom to perfect your songs. With taught sessions in our Mac Labs, you'll learn how to bring those songs to life using industry-standard software such as Logic Pro. All of this takes place alongside the study of the music industry, its history, and context, artistry and creativity.

MASTERCLASSES

AUDITIONS & INTERVIEW TIPS



The audition and interview process varies depending on which course(s) you have applied for.

It's a tense time for any performer but, with good preparation, those on-the-day nerves can be easily dealt with. Here are our top tips to help make your day less daunting:

1. CHOOSE A PIECE THAT REPRESENTS YOU

It's important that you choose a piece that shows who you are as a performer - show us what makes you stand out. When it comes to Pop Music auditions, for example, don't feel restricted to the Grade 8 syllabus. Pick something that speaks to you personally, something you're passionate about and that mirrors your style. This way, we can get a real sense of what drives you.

2. PRACTISE! PRACTISE! PRACTISE!

It sounds like an obvious one, but make sure you know your audition materials like the back of your hand. Being faced with an unfamiliar environment at an audition can be unnerving – but you will feel much more confident if you know that your muscle memory will back you up.

3. KEEP IT MANAGEABLE

It might be tempting to think that you have to present the most challenging piece in an audition, but it's important not to play or perform beyond yourself, and to play or perform honestly. Stay true to yourself and your abilities. It's better to play something you're confident in, rather than struggling through a difficult piece. Auditions are about demonstrating your musicianship, so focus on playing fluently and authentically.

4. GETTING THE INTERVIEW RIGHT

Most people would admit to finding interviews and auditions stressful, but if your audition is an opportunity to prove your ability, then your interview is the chance to make it clear why you deserve a place on your chosen course. Have a clear idea of what you want to get across and practise saying it. We would also recommend you always prepare some questions for the panel too.

"Bring lots of questions with you – this is your opportunity to find out everything you want to know about training here at the conservatoire – so please do ask away, there are no silly questions!"

5. DON'T WING IT

Embrace the opportunity to learn. It's okay not to have all the answers. Instead of pretending, acknowledge areas where you may lack knowledge and express your eagerness to learn. Admitting what you don't know can be a powerful step towards growth and improvement.

6. BE YOURSELF

Auditions are your opportunity to demonstrate who you are as an artist.

Leeds is the hometown of multi-million selling artists like Kaiser Chiefs, and Corinne Bailey Rae as well as home to internationally recognised performing companies, such as Opera North.

VISAS AND IMMIGRATION

Any information on visas in this prospectus or on our website is subject to change by UK Visas and Immigration and should be independently verified upon application. For full details, visit: gov.uk/student-visa

WORKING

Many international students can work up to 20 hours per week during term time – your Biometric Residence Permit details your specific circumstances – but you cannot be self-employed or work as an entertainer. Instead of performing at external gigs, you can take advantage of similar opportunities provided by us. We encourage you to try out new material in informal settings and you can find out more about this, and general working rights, at: leedsconservatoire.ac.uk/international-work.

ENGLISH REQUIREMENTS

If you require a Student Visa to study in the UK, you'll need an approved English Language qualification that scores individual components in relation to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) at B2 or higher (e.g., IELTS Academic with an overall score of 6.0 and no sub-test below 5.5). Please see our website for details of alternative qualifications we can accept.

If you are a national of a UKVI-recognised Majority English Language Speaking Country, you won't need to prove your knowledge of English to UKVI for a visa application, but you will need to meet the Conservatoire's minimum English Language requirement of GCSE grade C/4 or equivalent level qualification.
